Explanation

For many years the price of our drinks was comparable with local pubs such as the Dog and Gun. In order to conserve margins prices have now crept up and we are at least 10% more expensive than the local pubs. When compared with local sporting clubs the differential is far greater. For instance pint of lager is £1.00 cheaper at Fordhouses Cricket Club.

Members are going elsewhere, there are very few new faces in the bar in the evenings this lack of footfall also impacts on our restaurant takings.

Our members are paying £660 a year, this is the main income stream of the club. Members should not be paying premium bar prices on top of this.
